

Lifeline and Tribal Lands Discounts

Great Plains Communications participates in the **Lifeline government benefit program** to make qualifying broadband internet and residential telephone service per household* more affordable to eligible low-income individuals and families. **Monthly discounts up to \$9.25 are available to qualifying customers.**

To be eligible for Lifeline you must be enrolled in one or more of the following assistance programs or and/or meet specified income requirements noted below.

- Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP)
- Supplemental Security Income (SSI)
- Medicaid
- Federal Public Housing Assistance (FPHA)
- Veterans Pension or Survivors Benefit Programs
- Income is at or below 135% of the Federal Poverty guidelines

A subscriber who lives on federally recognized Tribal lands and is eligible, may receive a monthly discount up to \$34.25. To be eligible the household* must participate in one of the above-listed qualifying programs or one of the following Tribal specific federal assistance programs:

- Tribal Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (Tribal TANF)
- Tribal Head Start
- Bureau of Indian Affairs General Assistance
- Food Distribution Program on Indian Reservations (FDPIR)

Lifeline service is not transferable. Only eligible consumers may enroll in the program. Consumers who willfully make false statements to obtain Lifeline service can be fined, imprisoned or barred from the program. * A household is defined as any individual or group of individuals who live together at the same address and share income and expenses.
